Crime Control and Prevention District

What is it, how it's created and purpose

- Texas Local Government Code Title 11 Public Safety Chapter 363
- Created through election (voted on citizens of community)
- Governed by board of citizens or council
- Funded through sales tax collected by city (1/8th of 1%) *DOES NOT increase any taxes.
- Generates additional funding the Department can utilize to purchase necessary equipment and address staffing issues by funding additional personnel.
- Provides Police Department funds to help local community resources (Comal/ Guadalupe County Crisis Centers, Child Advocacy Center and after-school programs)

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Sales tax projections for the past several budgets have been conservative.

Actual sales tax received have increased significantly more than budgeted projections

Current budget forecast projections by CONB **only** propose adding 3 officers per year at a cost of \$600,000 annually To catch up and keep up with growth, the actual need is much greater!!!

Current staffing strategy is woefully inadequate

CRIME CONTROL AND PREVENTION DISTRICT (CCPD) Current Sales Tax Distribution

- As mentioned earlier, sales taxes are the sole funding source for these districts
- State and local sales tax rates are capped at 8.25%. The graph illustrates the current allocation of total sales tax collections in the City of New Braunfels
 - Comal County .5% = 1/2 cent
 - NBEDC .375% = 3/8 cent
 - City Prop Tax Relief .125% = 1/8 cent
 - City General Fund 1% = 1 cent
 - State 6.25% 6 ¼ cents
- If an election to establish a CCPD was called, it would need to concurrently determine what allocation was being reduced or eliminated



Re-allocation of collected sales tax

Re-allocation of the New Braunfels Economic DevelopmentCorporation from3/8cent to 1/4 cent

Based on updated revenue projections, 1/8th of a cent would generate approximately \$3 million to aid the Police Department to address staffing shortages and strengthen partnerships with community groups.

Department's ability to provide safe environment is important to PD and citizens

Public Safety has been rated at the top of citizen's of NB responded to survey.

Tremendous growth of city with slow growth of department are not a good strategy.

- Current Population is approximately 100,000 (does not account for year-round tourism)
- National average for officers per resident is 2 officers per 1,000 resident
- Current PD size 152 sworn personnel (Officer to Chief)
- Current population should be approximately 200 personnel total not including civilian staff.

Who has CCPD?

How does a Special Tax District work?

- The statute requires the appointment of a Temporary Board to consider a two-year strategic plan and budget plan
- If approved by voters, districts can exist for 5 years
- A referendum election must be called near the end of this 5-year period to continue or dissolve the districts
- Voters may then approve the districts for 5, 10, 15 or 20 years.

What can you do?

- Contact your council member expressing your support for CCPD. Right now there are only 2 council members in support of creating the CCPD. Council can vote to place the CCPD on the ballot, allowing YOU the citizens to decide.
- If you want to get involved, you can volunteer to serve on the CCPD board (let your council member know) You can also share this information with your neighbors and friends.
